

Activity: Teach me to do something

Addresses: Teamwork; Leadership; Communication.

Aims/Intended Learning Outcomes:

Students develop their creativity, their ability to communicate and to teach.

Time required: depends on the group size. Small teams are formed (2 to 3 students) to conduct the activity, each team is allowed to use around 2 to 3 minutes for their activity.

Group size: At least two teams are required - the minimum size would then be 4. No maximum size limit.

Context/setting: Any (in the classroom - on the campus - in the Halls of Residence - outdoors - in a café, etc.

Description:

1. On a previous session, students are asked to form groups of 2 to 3 people.
2. Each group must think of an activity they must teach the others. It has to be something they must do/make/create (i.e. they cannot teach some words in a different language, for instance, but they can teach them how to do an origami flower, among many other things).
3. During the session every team will only have 2 to 3 minutes to teach the whole group how to do/make/create the chosen item.
4. The group will finally say if they have actually learnt to do what was suggested.
